## SCORER RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Parents may score for their own children
  - Parents have 2 options if they are unable to fulfill their scoring responsibilities...
- 2. **OPTION #1** -- Contribute \$40 per scoring date to the Junior Golf Program which allows the Golf Professionals to arrange their scorers for the year. Those scorers will be paid cash out of the junior golf contribution fund after they have submitted their groups score sheet. This option transfers all responsibility of scoring to the Golf Professional Staff eliminating the possibility of incurring a \$75 no show fee.
- 3. **OPTION #2** -- Choose their sub from the approved scorers roster (see one of your golf professionals) and make arrangements for dates and payment on their own. This option holds the parent 100% responsible for supplying a scorer. If a scorer is not arranged or doesn't show, the parent will be charged a \$75 junior golf contribution fee to their account.

#### Scoring

• In stroke play, a player who is acting as a marker should, on the way to the next tee, check the score with the player concerned and record it.

#### **Bag Storage**

• Bag storage will be made available for all juniors for a fee of \$50 per year. Anyone not interested in this service please remember to take your clubs with you when you leave.

#### 18 HOLF DIVISION

- 1. All players will walk and carry their own bags.
- 2. All players are to observe and use proper golf etiquette at all times on the course. Golf bags are not to be placed on the putting greens, always rake any sand traps that have been used, and repair all ball marks on the green.
- 3. U.S.G.A. rule will be used at all times. (ALL PARTICIPANTS MUST HAVE A COPY OF THE U.S.G.A. RULE BOOK IN THEIR BAGS).
- 4. All players should arrive at the course, check in and be ready to play by 7:00am.

#### Junior boy requirements

- Shirts tucked in with sleeves and collars
- No cut-off shorts
- No tank tops

## ETIQUETTE & BEHAVIOR POLICIES

#### Junior girls requirements

• No short shorts, halter tops or cut-off shorts

#### **General requirements**

- No blue jeans are allowed on the golf course or practice facilities
- All hats must be worn with the bill facing forward.

#### **Golf Carts**

• Juniors will not be allowed to stand on or hang off the golf carts at any time.

#### **Spirit of Game**

Unlike many sports, golf is played, for the most part, with out
the supervision of a referee or umpire. The game relies on the
integrity of the individual to show consideration for other players and to abide by the Rules. All players should conduct themselves in a disciplined manner, demonstrating courtesy and
sportsmanship at all times, irrespective of how competitive they
may be. This is the spirit of the game of golf.

#### Etiquette

 Players should always show consideration for other players on the course and should not disturb their play by moving, talking or making unnecessary noise.

- 4. Arrival time and length of time scorers will be needed is as follows: 3 hole scorers are 7:15 9:00, 5 hole scorers are 7:45 10:30, and 9 hole scorers are 7:15 11:00. If you fail to fulfill your scoring commitment you will be fined \$75 billed to your account.
- 5. Everyone is required to score 3 times per family plus 1 additional time per extra child participating in the program.
- **6.** Parents may score for their own children.
- 7. Scorers are to keep track of strokes taken on each hole and confirm with each junior on how many strokes he or she had on each hole.
- 8. Scorers are to encourage and compliment the junior on their play. Scorers should also educate the juniors on proper etiquette, but refrain from coaching or teaching.
- 9. If a question arises about a rule, try to contact the golf shop, or have the player play two balls and get a ruling when the round is over. The player is not to sign their scorecard until a ruling is made.
- 10. Scorers may take golf carts, but may not let juniors ride on the carts except when transporting them to their starting hole, or from the green to the next tee, and over the railroad tracks.
- 11. Do not bring extra children with you to score.
- Please drive juniors over the railroad tracks, juniors are forbidden to walk over railroad tracks.
- 13. Please make sure that the scores you turn in for the juniors are accurate scores. Allowing a junior to hit mulligans or not to count all their strokes only hurts the junior and the program.
- 14. Please no smoking while scoring!
- 15. We encourage the juniors to play "READY GOLF"
- 16. If you have more than one child in junior golf you must split your scoring dates equally among each division beginning with the oldest division.
- 17. Check in with the division chairperson when you arrive to score so they can check you off the list and assign you to a group without delay.
- 18. If you cannot score on your set date, YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR FIND-ING A REPLACEMENT. If you fail to show up or your replacement fails to show up, you will be fined a \$75.00 contribution fee to the Junior Golf Program. The Golf Staff has a list of approved scorers. Please contact Matt Gindler to get a scorer approved. You may also pay \$40 cash per scoring date and the Golf Shop will arrange scorers for you.

#### **SIGN-UP RULES**

The Golf Shop will accept sign-ups 2 weeks in advance of each clinic. Each junior can only sign-up every other week with the following exception: you may call on the Tuesday before each clinic to see if there is an opening for your junior, if there is, we will sign them up. If you need further explanation please ask Matt Gindler, Sam Lee, or Matt Stock.

## 9 HOLE DIV. LEVEL 1 WHITE TEE

- 1. Boys Division
- 2. All players will walk and carry their own bags.
- 3. All players are to observe and use proper golf etiquette at all times on the course. Golf bags are not to be placed on the putting greens, always rake any sand traps that have been used, and repair all ball marks on the green.
- 4. U.S.G.A. rule will be used at all times. (ALL PARTICI-PANTS MUST HAVE A COPY OF THE U.S.G.A. RULE BOOK IN THEIR BAGS).
- 5. This division will play from the White Tees using the custom scorecard provided.
- 6. 9-1 boys will have a target score of 55 (which is 24 over par). They will have to shoot the target score or better 2 times to advance to the 18-hole course.
- 7. There is NO maximum number of strokes per hole.
- 8. All 9-1 golfers will follow the 18-hole golfers off the first tee, and will play holes 1-9.
- 9. All players should arrive at the course, check in and be ready to play by 7:15 am.
- 10. If a player arrives after the last scorer has gone out, then they may play but their score will NOT count.
- 11. In order to move up to the 18-hole division you must know how to score for yourself and your playing partner according to U.S.G.A. rules.

## 9 HOLE DIV. LEVEL 1 RED TEE

- 1. Boys and Girls Division
- 2. All players will walk and carry their own bags.
- 3. All players are to observe and use proper golf etiquette at all times on the course. Golf bags are not to be placed on the putting greens, always rake any sand traps that have been used, and repair all ball marks on the green.
- 4. U.S.G.A. rule will be used at all times. (ALL PARTICI-PANTS MUST HAVE A COPY OF THE U.S.G.A. RULE BOOK IN THEIR BAGS).
- 5. This division will play from the Red Tees using the custom scorecard provided.
- 6. 9-1 boys will have a target score of 50 (which is 14 over par). They will have to shoot the target score or better 2 times to advance to the 9-1 White Division.
- 7. 9-1 girls will have a target score of 60 (which is 24 over par). They will have to shoot the target score or better 2 times to advance to the 18-hole course.
- 8. There is NO maximum number of strokes per hole.
- 9. All 9-1 golfers will follow the 18 hole golfers off the first tee, and will play holes 1-9.
- 10. All players should arrive at the course, check in and be ready to play by 7:15 am.
- 11. If a player arrives after the last scorer has gone out, then they may play but their score will NOT count.
- 12. In order to move up to the 18-hole division you must know how to score for yourself and your playing partner according to U.S.G.A. rules.

## 3 HOLE DIVISION

- 1. Three holers will be driven out to their designated starting holes by their respective scorer.
- 2. All players are to observe and use proper golf etiquette at all times on the course. Golf bags are not to be placed on the putting greens, always rake any sand traps that have been used, and repair all ball marks on the green.
- 3. Only one practice swing per shot.
- 4. OB or (out-of-bounds) if a ball is lost or is out-of-bounds, the player must play a ball, UNDER PENALTY OF ONE STROKE, as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was last played.
- 5. 3-Hole Division will play on the practice holes from the designated family tee markers.
- 6. The maximum number of strokes per hole is 10. If you take the max. score on a hole you cannot break.
- 7. The golf course will consist of 1 par 5, 1 par 3, and 1 par 4, with a total distance of 300 yards.
- 8. Anyone playing in the 3 hole division will have to hit the designated target score of 18 (which is 6 over par) two times to advance to the 5-2 division.
- 9. All players should arrive at the course, check in and be ready to play by 7:30 am.
- 10. If a player arrives after the last scorer has gone out, they may play but their score will NOT count.

## 5 HOLE DIVISIONS

- 1. 5 Hole Division will be driven out to their designated starting holes. Then they must walk and carry their own bags during play of each hole.
- 2. All players are to observe and use proper golf etiquette at all times on the course. Golf bags are not to be placed on the putting greens, always rake any sand traps that have been used, and repair all ball marks on the green.
- 3. Only one practice swing per shot.
- 4. OB (out-of-bounds) if a ball is lost or out-of-bounds the player must play a ball, UNDER PENALTY OF ONE STROKE, as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was last played.
- 5. All 5-2/5-1 golfers will play from the designated junior tee boxes on holes 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18.
- 6. 5-2 division course will consist of 2 par 5s, 2 par 4s, and 1 par 3 with a total distance of 743 yards.
- 7. 5-1 division course will consist of 2 par 5s, 2 par 4s, and 1 par 3 with a total distance of 893 yards.
- 8. 5-2 division will have to hit the designated target score of 31 (which is 10 over par) two times to advance to the 5-1 division.
- 9. 5-1 golfers will have to hit the designated target score of 31 (which is 10 over par) two times to advance to the 9-2 course.
- 10. The maximum number of strokes per hole is 10. If you take the max. score on a hole you cannot break.
- 11. All players should arrive at the course, check in and be ready to play by 7:30am in order to make pairings.
- 12. If a player arrives after the last scorer has gone out, they may play but their score will NOT count.

## 9 HOLE DIVISION LEVEL 2

- 1. All players will walk and carry their own bags.
- 2. All players are to observe and use proper golf etiquette at all times on the course. Golf bags are not to be placed on the putting greens, always rake any sand traps that have been used, and repair all ball marks on the green.
- 3. U.S.G.A. rules will be used at all times. (ALL PARTICI-PANTS MUST HAVE A COPY OF THE U.S.G.A. RULE BOOK IN THEIR BAGS)
- 4. All 9-2 BOYS & GIRLS will play from the designated junior tee boxes on holes 1-9. (Level 1 Family Tee)
- 5. All 9-2 boys will play a course that is 2,126 yards with a par of 36.
- 6. All 9-2 girls will play a course that is 2,126 yards with a par of 39.
- 7. 9-2 BOYS will have a target score of 50 (which is 14 over par). They will have to shoot the target score or better 2 times to advance to the 9-1 Red Tee Division.
- 8. 9-2 GIRLS will have a target score of 53 (which is 14 over par). They will have to shoot the target score or better 2 times to advance to the 9-1 Red Tee Division.
- 9. Maximum number of strokes per hole is 12. If you take the max. score on a hole you cannot break.
- 10. All players should arrive at the course, check in and be ready to play by 7:15 am.
- 11. If a player arrives after the last scorer has gone out, they may play but their score will NOT count.
- 12. In order to move to 9-1 you must learn to score for yourself in accordance with U.S.G.A. rules.
